To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WUEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled an "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, acres, in favor of Leonard marson Warrant No. 438 for 120 an Ensign in leaptain Valentines leampany of New York militia, War of 18131

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South meat quarter of the South East quarter, and the South half of the South West quarter, of Section four, in Town ship ninety one North , of Range twinty Eight West, in the Destrict of Lands Subject to Sale at Fort Des moines, Source, containing one hundred and twenty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the Said Warrant having been apigned by the Said Leonard Maison to John W. Brady, in whose favor Said tracks have been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John W13 rady, as apignee as aforesaid, and to his hirs

the tract s of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract s of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John M. Brady, as apigne as aporesaid, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Franklin Purce PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
