Mrs Rodger Fawcett, 27

HARLAN — Ann Marie Fawcett, daughter of Theodore and Lois (Killmon) Bradley, was born in Creston, on April 19, 1950. She died at University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha, Nebr., on Sept. 18, 1977, at age 27 years, four months and 29 days. Ann attended schools in Creston and then moved with her parents to Co. Bluffs, where she attended Thomas Jefferson high school, graduating in 1968. On June 6, 1968, she married Rodger Fawcett at the Epworth Methodist church in Co. Bluffs. Two sons were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Fawcett made their home in Des Moines. They later lived in Webster City and Rock Rapids before moving to Harlan in May of 1975. This has been her home since that time. Ann was a member of the First United Methodist church in Harlan and was a member of the United Methodist Women and Martha Circle. She was also a member of the Newcomers and Young Mothers clubs in Harlan.

She was preceded in death by her paternal grandparents and by her maternal grandmother. Her survivors include her husband, Rodger, of Harlan; two sons, Ryan and Randy, both at home; her parents, Mr and Mrs Ted Bradley of Co. Bluffs and her maternal grandfather, Walter Killmon of Creston, by two sisters - Jean (Mrs Mike Bailey) of Omaha and Vicki Bradley of Co. Bluffs; a brother, David Bradley, of Omaha; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan, on Wednesday, Sept. 21, 1977, with Rev. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Graceland cemetery in Creston, with Bob Krejci, Ron Nelson, Kenneth Kast, John Van Aartsen, Richard A. Killmon, and John A. Christiansen serving as casketbearers.
