Ernest Kardell, son of Chris and Louise Mansfield Kardell, was born in Germany on Aug. 20, 1905. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on Aug. 21, 1974, just one day after his 69th birthday. Ernest came to the U.S. in Oct. of 1923 and settled in Shelby, la. He married Lucille Roberts on Oct. 7, 1931 in Omaha, Nebr. Four children were born to this union.
