MARY KAUFMAN, 70
Mary Kaufman, daughter of
George and Frances Stolz Schneider
was born on a farm near Westphalia
on Aug. 23, 1895. She died at Myrtue
Memorial hospital in Harlan on Dec.
13, 1975, at age 90 years, 3 months
and 10 days. She grew to adulthood
on her parent's farm attending St.
Boniface school and she was baptized and confirmed in St. Boniface
Catholic church in Westphalia. On
Sept. 29, 1903, she married August
Kaufman in St. Boniface Catholic
church at Westphalia. 12 children
were born to this union. After their
marriage Mr and Mrs Kaufman
farmed near Westphalia. After Mr
Kaufman's death in 1932, Mary
continued to make her home on the
farm until 1950, when she moved into
Westphalia, living there until Oct. of
1972. She then made her home in
Earling, with her daughter, Mrs
Marie Gross. Mrs Kaufman was a
lifetime member of the St. Boniface
Catholic church and St. Boniface
Altar and Rosary Society.
