Clara, daughter of Peter and Bertha Knickrehm Joens, was born November 5, 1887 at Keystone, Iowa. She was educated at the local school. She also took voice and organ lessons.

On April 19, 1911, Clara was united in marriage with Edward Kettler. They made their home at Watkins, for 11 years and then moved to Lidderdale. Clara's husband was associated with the banks in those communities. After a brief residence in Carroll they moved to Ir-win, in 1928. Ed was on the Staff of the Farming Savings Bank there and served as bank cashier and President. Ed and Clara continued to make their home in Irwin after his retirment in 1951. They celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary in 1971. Ed died later that year. The next year Clara moved to Newport News, Virginia to live with her daughter, Minerva

During the years in Virginia she attended Trinity Lutheran Church there.

Funeral services for Mrs. Kettler were held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, January 7, 1986, at Trinity Lutheran Church, Newport News, Virginia with the Reverands Thomas Bosserman and A.G. Austion officiating. Her body was be brought to Iowa where funeral services were held Friday, January 10, 1986, at Zion Lutheran Church in Manning with burial in the Manning City Cemetery.
