Two years ago the family moved to South Sioux City, so that Mr. Liewer could be near his work in Sioux City

Mr. Liewer shortly after moving to South Sioux City started alling in health and became a victim of a heart ailment. His death occurred at St. Vincint hospital Tuesday evening, July 15.

Mr. Liewer was married in 1909 to Marie M. Book and to the union three children were born, Editor Edwin of Crofton, Walter of Los Altos, California and Sr. M Pleire (Helen) of La Crosse, Wisconsin. Mrs. Liewer preceded her husband in death in 1919 during the Spanish influenza epidemic. In 1922 Mr. Liewer married Miss Eda Dwyer of Randolph.
