Norma Jean Ohms, daughter of Peter B.M. And Metta Marie Hjuler Sorensen, was born Dec. 14, 1933 on a farm in Audubon co. She was baptized and confirmed at the Bethany Lutheran church near Kimballton. She attended the Sharon Township Country school, growing to adulthood on the family farm.

On Feb. 17, 1957, she married Amond Ohms at the Bethany Lutheran church near Kimballton. Three children, Neil, Diane and Lori, were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Kirkman, for a few years. Since 1960, they have farmed in the Corley vicinity.

She was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran church in Harlan and a member of the No. 6 Church circle. She was also a Charter member of the Shelby County Porkettes as well as one of their reporters for three years. She was the 4-H leader for the Fairview Funsters and a member of the Happy Homemakers. She recently became a representative for the Harlan area on the council for consumer education for Iowa Western Community College.

She died on Thursday, Dec. 10, 1981, just four days before her 48th birthday.

She was preceded in death by her parents. Survivors include her husband, Amond of rural Harlan; one son, Neil, living at home; two daughters, Diane of Ames. and
