## Helmer Olsen, 60

Harlan — Helmer Howard Olsen, son of Nels and Anna Laugensen Olsen was born on a farm in Lincoln twp., Shelby county on Dec. 5, 1918. He was baptized and confirmed at the Harlan Immanuel Lutheran church. He attended country school and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. Helmer entered the armed forces in June of 1942 and served overseas for months with the 376th Parachute Artillery Battalion. After receiving his honorable discharge in July of 1945, he returned to Shelby county where he farmed for a number of years. He spent his later life in Chariton.

'Mr Olsen died at the Veterans

Administration Medical Center in Des Moines on Wednesday, May 2, 1979, at age 60 years, 4 months and 27 days. Helmer had attended the Lutheran church throughout his life and was a member of the American Legion Post No. 322 of

Elk Horn.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Mary Jane Olsen. Survivors in-clude five sisters - Agneta (Mrs Harvey B. Jensen) of Elk Horn, Ruby (Mrs Dale Christensen) of Russell, Betty (Mrs William C.
