Thomas Allan Pederson, son of Olga and Albert Pederson was born May 26, 1930 at Iowa City. He was educated at the Manly public schools. mont, Neb., Denison, Mesa, Ariz. and Lincoln, Neb. since.
He was a member of the First Christian church of Harlan. He died on Sunday,
Oct. 23, 1983 at the Maplewood Care Center in Lincoln, Neb., at the age of 53 years,

four months and 27 days.
