John Otto Petersen, son of Christine Larsen and Carl Petersen was born July 26, 1891, in Jackson twp., Shelby co. He was educated in the rural Jackson twp. schools and attended the Harlan Business College. He farmed in Jackson twp. before entering the U.S. Army during World War I.

On March 19, 1919, he married Anna Olsen near Corley and to this union two children were born. They farmed in Clay and Monroe twp. for 27 years before moving

to Harlan in 1946, where he did carpenter work for a number of years.

On July 27, 1950, he married Myrtle Faurschou at Omaha. He was baptized at the Bethlehem Lutheran church at Jacksonville and attended the First Baptist church of Harlan. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan at the age of 91 years and 9 months.

Mr Petersen was preceded in death by his parents, his first wife, Anna in 1945; 4 brothers, Peter, Alfred, William and Carl; six sisters, Mamie Albertson, Laura Armentrout, Anna Noon, Ella Dahlof, Rosa Armentrout and Louise Madsen.
