## Andrew Peterson

Andrew Peterson, son of Peter S. and Anna Maria Andressen Peterson, was born on a farm in Shelby county, on Sept. 16, 1883. He died at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan, on Jan. 1, 1977, at 93 years, three months and 15 days. He attended country school and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. On Febr. 6, 1907, he married Emma J. Olson in Douglas township. Two daughters were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Peterson lived in Fiscus for two years. They then moved to Casey and this was their home for six years. In 1915 they moved to a farm south of Harlan, where they lived for 30 years. They moved into Harlan in 1945. They became residents of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan in 1969 and this has been his home since that time. Mrs Peterson died this past September. Andy was a member of the First Christian church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents and his wife, he was preceded in death by a daughter, Ruby in 1947; two sisters - Jane and Elsie; and by three brothers - James, George and Martin. His survivors include a daughter, Goldie (Mrs John Richards) of Grass Valley, Calif.; two grandchildren - Janice Love of Washington, D. C. and Donna Miller of Phoenix, Ariz.; five great-grandchildren; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan on Tuesday, Jan. 4, 1977 with Pastor Don L. Schoepf, pastor of the First Christian church in Harlan, officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery, with Ray Ferry, Lanny Olsen, Merle Nelson, Elmer Nissen, Wayne Petersen and Archie Peterson
