The Life Story of --

CHARLOTTE PLUMB, 68

Charlotte Plumb, daughter of John and Henrietta Stewart Boardman was born on a farm north of Tennant on Aug. 25, 1907. She died at St. Joseph's hospital in Omaha, Nebr., Feb. 12, 1976, at age 68 years, 5 months and 17 days. She grew to adulthood on her parent's farm attending country school for three years and then graduated from the Tennant consolidated school. She then attended college for two years at Cedar Falls. Charlotte taught school near Akron for three years. On July 14, 1929, she married Harold Plumb at her parent's home near Tennant. To this union three children were born. After their marriage, they farmed in Shelby county until their retirement in 1962. At that time, Mr and Mrs Plumb built their home at 1504 Linda Lane in Harlan and this has been their home since that time.

She was preceded in death by her parents and one brother, Gene Boardman. In addition to her husband, Harold of Harlan, she is survived by two sons - John (Jack) Plumb of Danvers, Mass., and Donald Plumb, Harlan, one daughter, Marilyn (Mrs Esmat Nouri) of Oneonta, N.Y. and five

grandchildren; by three brothers - Howard Boardman of Leesburg, Fla., Jesse Boardman and David Boardman, both of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Monday, Feb. 16, 1976 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Rev. Larry LaVelle, pastor of the First United Methodist church in Harlan officiating. Burial was in the Harlan cemetery with Vic Morgan, Joe Schomer, Mike Petsche, Raymond Davis, Cliff Springer and Clifford Hanson serving as casketbearers.
