IRWIN — Joseph Johannas Pries was born Feb. 17, 1906 in Amazon, Mo. He was the son of Joseph and Elizabeth Krueger Pries. He died at Bishop Clarkson hospital in Omaha, Nebr. on Jan. 13, 1974 at age 67 years, 10 months, 26 days.
