Kathryn "Kattie" Irene Reynolds, daughter of Cain and Mary German Hobbs, was born Jan. 23, 1909 in Horton, Kans. At the age of 2½, she moved with her family to Harrison co., Mo. She attended the country school in Harrison co. and also in Des Moines and first worked at the age of 9.

On Nov. 25, 1925, she married Albert G. Reynolds in Bethany, Mo. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in Mo. until 1940, when they moved to Shelby co.
