Louis Bernard Ring, son of John A. and Carrie Mae Ring, was born on a farm in Pottawattamie county, on June 29, 1909. He died at Mercy hospital in Council Bluffs, on June 19, 1976, at age 66 years, 11 months and 20 days. He was baptized at St. Mary's Catholic church in Avoca, and attended country school. As a young boy he moved with his parents to a farm near Neola. He was confirmed in St. Patrick's Catholic church in Neola and grew to adulthood on his parent's farm. On Nov. 28, 1931, he married Charlotte Torneten in Tekumseh, Nebr. Seven children were born to this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Ring farmed in the Co.
