

Herbert J. Thordsen, 82

Persia — Herbert Julius Thordsen, son of Hans F. and Mary (Goss) Thordsen, was born on a farm in Pottawattamie county near Neola on Dec. 20, 1894. He died in Mercy hospital in Co. Bluffs on Nov. 20, 1977, at age 82 years and 11 months. Mr Thordsen served in the Army during WWI. He spent a year in France serving in five different fronts, including the Argonne Forest. After receiving his honorable discharge, he returned to Persia.

On Sept. 17, 1919, he married Lennie Alma Kemmish at her parent's home five miles west of Persia. Three sons were born to this union. Even though these three children were lost to them in infancy, Mr and Mrs Thordsen contributed greatly to their own this union. After their marriage, Mr and Mrs Thordsen farmed near Persia for almost 20 years. In 1936 they moved into Persia where Herbert owned and operated a trucking line until 1948. He then engaged in carpenter work until 1971 when he was forced to retire after being injured in a car-truck accident. He remained in Persia until Nov. 8th of this year when he became a resident of the Westmont Care Center in Logan. This has been his home since that time.
