



THE LIFE STORY OF —

Alma K. Troll, 85

Atlantic — Alma Katherine Troll, daughter of Michael and Katherine Hagge Fideler, was born July 3, 1895 in Remsen. She was baptized as an infant in Remsen and later confirmed at the Harlan Immanuel Lutheran church. She grew to adulthood in Delmont, So. Dak.

On March 20, 1929, she married William Ludwig Troll in Delmont. One son, Louie, was born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Walnut. Mr Troll died in Feb. of 1942 and Alma then continued to make her home on their farm until 4½ years ago, when she became a resident of Atlantic Care Center in Atlantic. She was a member of the Harlan Immanuel Lutheran church. She died at the Atlantic Care Center on Saturday, June 6, 1981, at age 85 years, 11 months and 3 days.

In addition to her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by seven brothers, Alfred, Morris, Arthur, William, Alvin, Michael and Louie Fideler. Survivors include her son, Louie, of Walnut; two grandchildren; Linda (Mrs Chuck) Ploen and Leanne (Mrs Jeff) Krueger, both of Walnut; three great grandchildren, Jason and Eva Ploen and Nicholas Krueger; one brother, Ervin Fideler of Omaha, Neb. and one sister, Louise Klienlien of Scotland, So. Dak.; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Harlan Immanuel Lutheran church, Tuesday, June 9, 1981, at 10:30 a.m. with Pastor Kenneth P. Alpers officiating. Burial was in the Walnut cemetery with Lloyd Troll, Edward Holst, Leonard Troll, Wilfred Troll, Alvin A. Troll and Herman Groeper serving as casketbearers.
