She attended country school and graduated from Avoca High School with the class of 1928, earning a normal training certificate. She was a member of the Myrtue Memorial Hospital Auxiliary and served on the Board for six years. After a short stay at the Avoca Nursing and Rehab Center, she died Jan. 30, 2002, at age 89 years, eight months and 17 days.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Ernest; her daughter and son-in-law, Eleanor and Michael Quinn; and her brother, Harry Johnson. She is survived by her daughter, Laura Ann (Charlie) Allen; her sons, Marlin Andersen (Darlene) and Robert Andersen (Linda), all of Avoca; 12 grandchildren; 26 great grandchildren; three great grandchildren and other relatives.
