## George Chambers, 79

KIRKMAN — George Winfield Chambers was born March 28, 1927, to William J. and Matilda (McConnell) Chambers at their home east of Harlan. After graduation, he worked for different farmers, the Harlan landfill, Red Adams Construction, and for several years at the Harlan Municipal Utilities. "High Pockets", as he was known, was a member of the United Methodist Church in Kirkman and regularly attended services. George was also a member of the Kirkman Volunteer Fire Department and was proud to serve on the department. George enjoyed gardening immensely often taking his crops
