## Lyle Christensen, 76 March 6, 1934 - Feb. 2, 2011

They lived on the farm until they moved to Harlan in December of 2010. Lyle attended St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Audubon with his wife Marlene and was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Kimballton. Lyle enjoyed polka dancing, playing cards and going to coffee with friends. He enjoyed spending time with his family especially with his grandchildren.
