Drafted into the Army in 1943 for World War II, Dick was


a D-Day veteran who landed on Omaha Beach and saw action across France to include the Battle of the Bulge. He transitioned into the reserves at the end of the war, completing almost 44 years of distinguished military service. Dick worked at the Union Pacific Railroad his entire adult life until his retirement, and was a life-long member of St. Patrick's Church in Omaha until its closure last month.

Dick was united in marriage to Margaret Goeser on May 2, 1953. Together they had six children, 11 grandchildren, and one great grandchild.

Dick was preceded in death by his parents and one of his sons, Robert, who passed away in 1968.
