HARLAN - Gwenive Catherine Dinkel, age 98, passed away Tuesday, May 17, 2011, at the Elm Crest Retirement Community in Harlan, where she had resided for the past six years. Gwen was born on August 30, 1912, in Blockton, the second of five children of Lena and Allen Stephens. She grew up in the Diagonal area and attended Diagonal High School, where she met her future husband, Robert Dinkel. During her high school years, Gwen earned the admiration of her fellow students and instructors and was prominent in school activities. She graduated from Diagonal High School in 1931.

She looked forward to visits from her children, and especially delighted in visits from her many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Reflecting on her life several years ago, Gwen comments, "I wonder why the Lord has let me live so long. It's been wonderful!"
