Church in Randolph. Their union was blessed with three children: Larry, Charley and Jan. The Gubbels farmed at Belden, NE, until moving to Denison, where Merle was an insurance agent. After his retirement from the insurance industry, he served as Crawford County Weed Commissioner for many years. Merle was a member of St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church in Denison, Knights of Columbus Council 2074 and the American Legion Post 8, Denison. He was an avid Nebraska Cornhusker fan as well as a fan of the Iowa Hawkeyes. He was an excellent woodworker and glass cutter making many beautiful things for his family. He will be remembered for his love and passion for his family and his sense of humor. Merle died Friday afternoon, December 5, 2014, at Crawford County Memorial Hospital in Denison, having been blessed with 89 years, 4 months and 7 days.

Merle was preceded in death by his parents, sister, son-in-law and one brother-in-law.
