COUNCIL BLUFFS — Alice Marie Andersen Havick was born in Douglas Township in Audubon County, March 11, 1914. She was the daughter of Jens and Martha Andersen, who were residents of Audubon, except for about six years between 1922 and 1928 when the family lived on a farm near Leon. She was a member of the Audubon High School girls' basketball team that attended the state tournament. Upon graduation from Audubon High School, she worked in Harlan.

Alice married Jean Copeland Havick of Harlan, Dec. 31, 1937, and the couple resided in the Omaha - Council Bluffs area. During the 1950's she was employed by Central High School in Omaha, and later in the 1950's she was employed by the First National Bank in Omaha. Over the next 15 years, beginning in 1958, Alice and her husband owned and operated restaurants in Audubon, Missouri Valley and Red Oak. They returned to Council Bluffs in 1979. In Council Bluffs she was a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church and the Federated Club. She died April 13, 2006, of colon and kidney atrophy at age 92.

Alice is preceded in death by her husband, Jean; her brother, Edwin Andersen, who died in combat during World War II; another brother, the Reverend Leo Andersen, a Lutheran minister; and a sister, Myrtle Hansen, who lived her entire life in the Audubon community. Survivors include sisters, Freda Alff of Guthrie Center and Lorraine Simpson of Exira; a son, John Havick (Barbara) of Stone Mountain; and two grandchildren, Ann Havick Findley (David) and Steven Havick (Mary): and two great-grandchildren, Christopher and Elizabeth Findley.

A Celebration of Life funeral service was held April 18, 2006 at the Henry-Livingston Funeral Chapel with burial following at the Harlan Cemetery.
