DEFIANCE – Francis Clement Henkelman, son of Francis and Ann (McCaffery) Henkelman, was born May 31, 1925, in Manilla. He served two terms as Mayor from 1964 to 1968, he initiated the Defiance Sewer System, a member of the Defiance City Council, a Scout Master for three years, vice-president of the Holy Name Society for two years, a member of the American Legion Post No. 707, serving as Commander and County Commander. He died Jan. 13, 2002, at his home in Defiance, at age 76 years, seven months and 13 days.

Francis was preceded in death by his parents; two children, Francis and Ann; and his brothers and sister, Harold, Ray and Ardith.
