Carol loved family gatherings and spending time with her children and grandchildren. She also enjoyed having coffee, playing cards and visiting with family and friends. When guests arrived at their home, Carol was a gracious host making sure to offer a cup of coffee and something to eat. Christmas gatherings were always a very special time for Carol when she loved hosting a delicious meal for all her children and their families. Tea parties with her granddaughters were also very special to her. Carol made her home with Don in rural Harlan for nearly 65 years. In 2013 Carol and Don moved to the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn. Carol died on September 25, 2014 at the Myrtue Medical Center in Harlan having attained the age of eighty-four years, ten months and sixteen days.
