Dec. 9, 1909 - March 10, 1996 HARLAN - Johanne Larsen, daughter of Fredrik Christian Theodor and Nielsine (Christensen) Thomsen, was born Dec. 9, 1909 in

Bjergby, Denmark.

She came to the United States after she married Paul M. Larsen Feb. 6, 1931 in Bjergby. The couple settled in lowa, where he had worked as a farmhand. They went to work for Edgar Larson in April of 1931. Beginning the next year, they rented that farm until 1936, when they bought their own farm in the Cuppy's Grove area. In March, 1941, they purchased and moved to a larger farm also located in the Cuppy's Grove area. The year 1948 brought yet another move, this time to a farm southeast of Harlan. This has been their home since that time. She was a member of Bethel Baptist Church in Harlan where she was active in the Missionary Fellowship and also a member of the Happy Home Club. She died March 10. 1996 at Jennie Edmudson Memorial Hospital at age 86 years, 3 months and one day.

Preceding her in death were her parents, four brothers, four sisters and one granddaughter. Survivors include her husband, Paul M. Larsen of Harlan (He died March 18); one son, Kenneth (Marlene) Larsen of Calistoga, CA; one daughter, Rosalie (Richard) Andersen of Harlan; eight grandchildren and 14
