

Dallas C. Linden, 79

Nov. 6, 1921 – Oct. 13, 2001

TENNANT – Dallas Curtis Linden, son of Edith Gertrude (McKeighan) and Oscar P. Linden, was born Nov. 6, 1921, on a farm near Portsmouth. He was baptized at the Tennant Methodist Church in Tennant. He attended Cass No. 4 country school through the eighth grade, graduating from Tennant Consolidate High School. Following graduation, he worked for Cox Grain Company. He then farmed the family farm until purchasing and operating his own machine shop for two years in Tennant. He was employed at Tredway Implement for 15 years and then at G.A. Findley for 18 years. Dallas retired from the mechanic's trade in 1988. He was a member of the Tennant United Methodist Church where he also taught Sunday School for many years. He died Oct. 13, 2001, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital at age 79 years, 11 months and seven days.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by four brothers, David, Darrell, Dana and Duane; and two sisters, Esther Linden and Helen Hirsch Korn. He is survived by his brothers, Douglas Linden (Ellen) of Harlan and Dewey Linden (Dorothy) of Elk Horn; one sister, Wilma (Howell) McClure of Kingfield, ME; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Oct. 16, 2001, at Pauley Funeral Home with James Boardman officiating. Burial was in the Shelby Cemetery with Don Plumb, Jeff Lansman, Gale Linden, Myron Sorensen, Dave Gibson and Roy Williamson casket bearers.
