He also attended Boyles Business College in Omaha for a short time. After his schooling, Edmund joined the United States Navy on January 2, 1945 in Omaha. They loved making their home on an acreage with their two horses, chickens and cats and dogs. They loved rural life and safe environment to raise their children. He always had a generous heart and never met a stranger. Edmund and Audrey often took in people that were stranded on nearby Interstate 80 or parents of children who were patients at Children's Hospital in Omaha and needed a place to stay. He wanted to be a good example to his children and grandchildren so he quit drinking and smoking. He and Audrey were active in the Shelby Methodist Church where he also taught at Bible School. He always enjoyed spending time with his family especially teasing and scaring the grandchildren when they were little while playing in the basement. In 1998, Edmund and Audrey moved to a home in Shelby. After the death of his wife in 2001. Edmund remained at his home in Shelby until due to an accident in June of 2007, he moved to the Oakland Manor in Oakland. In 2012, Edmund then moved to the Elm Crest Retirement Home in Harlan. He died on Sunday, June 1, 2014 after a short stay at Myrtue Medical Center in Harlan having attained the age of eighty-seven years, four months and twenty-nine days.

In addition to his parents and wife, Edmund was preceded in death by his sisters: Esther, Marie, Ermina, Cecelia, Rita and Laurice and his brothers Richard and John.
