

Wanda C. Moser, 85

Sept. 26, 1916 - Sept. 16, 2002

WILLIAMSBURG – Wanda Cathrine Moser, daughter of George and Rosa Conrad Heitman, was born Sept. 26, 1916, on a farm in Summer Township, Iowa County, rural Marengo. She attended rural Iowa County schools. She was baptized and confirmed at the Trinity United Church of Christ, rural Marengo.

Sept. 30, 1936, Wanda married Elmer B. Moser in an evening candlelight ceremony at the Rosedale family farm by Rev. Louis A. Moser, Elmer's father and minister at the Trinity United Church of Christ from 1930 to 1937. To this union two children, Robert and Karen, were born. They farmed on the Rosedale farm until March of 1944, when they moved to a farm in Pilot Township. They farmed for many years in Iowa County and moved to Williamsburg in 1972 to the home Elmer built at 908 Elms Street. Wanda worked for the Amana Refrigeration plant for 23 years and retired in 1978. She was extremely active in the Presbyterian Church in Williamsburg. She also volunteered for the Red Cross blood drives and was active in the R.S.V.P. group. After suffering a massive CVA in 1999, she became a resident of Little Flower Rehabilitation and Nursing Center in Earling. It was there that she died Sept. 16, 2002, at age 85 years, 11 months and 20 days.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Elmer Moser; son, Robert Moser; sister, Glova Sheda; and brother, Wilbur Heitman. She is survived by one daughter, Karen (Kenneth) Sojka of Harlan; one brother, Milton Heitman of Marengo; grandchildren, Robert Moser (Laura) of Plantation, FL; Scott Sojka of Downers Grove, IL; Julie (Richard) Brown of Fort Lauderdale, FL; Suzanne (Kirk) Fjelstul of Decatur, GA; Jackie (Dennis) Knott of Bartlett, IL* and Jim Moser (Diana) of Texas; five great grandchildren; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Sept. 20, 2002, at the Presbyterian Church in Williamsburg. Burial was in the Genoa Bluffs Cemetery in Ladora.
