She attended Irwin Public Schools and graduated valedictorian of the Class of 1933. She attended Iowa State College in Ames for a short time before returning home to help care for her father who was dying of cancer.

Their second son Lynn arrived in 1953, Dorothy stayed at home for a time before starting to work part-time in the lunch program for the Manilla schools. In 1961 she started full time and then from 1968 to 1974 she was head cook. She was a member of the United Methodist Church in Manilla. After the death of her husband in 1996, she was able to remain in their home in Manilla until July of 2005 when she became a resident of the Manilla Manor, Her health had been declining for a number of years and she died May 6. 2007, at Crawford County Memorial Hospital in Denison at age 91 years, 2 months and 27 days.
