She is survived by her sons, Alan Nelsen of San Antonio, TX; Michael Nelsen (Mary Jane) of Raleigh, NC; and Duane Nelsen (Peggy) of Laffette, CA; eight grandchildren, Jennifer, Enoch, Lindsay, Katherine, Matthew, Mollie, Ashley and Michael; and other relatives.
