## Panama teen dies in accident Friday

Panama girl was killed, and four others were injured, in a one-vehicle accident southeast of here Friday afternoon, March 29.

Rebecca Pauley suffered fatal injuries when the vehicle she was riding in rolled near the intersection of County Road M16 and 225th St. in Crawford County.

Pauley was a backseat passenger in a 1990 Pontiac driven by Tammy Kay Schuler, 20, of Harlan. The accident occurred at approximately 3:30 p.m. Friday afternoon.

According to Iowa State Patrol reports, the Schuler vehicle was southbound on County Road M16 when Schuler allegedly lost control of the vehicle. The vehicle rolled before coming to rest upright.

Schuler was treated and released from Crawford County Hospital.

Heather Ellrott, 16, Portsmouth; Stacy Summers, 17, Harlan; and Emilee Summers, 16, Harlan; also suffered injuries in the accident. Ellrott was taken by Life Flight to University Hospital in Omaha in critical condition.

Stacy Summers was transported to an Omaha hospital in critical condition, while Emilee Summers was taken to Myrtue Memorial Hospital in Harlan, and later trans-
