Obituary

William Roach, son of Charles and Amelia Roach, was born in HenryCounty, near Mt. Pleasant, Iowa, August 18, 1869, and after a protracted illness, passed away at his home near Cumming, Iowa, April 7, 1938, at the age of 68 years, 7 months and 20 days.

He came with his parents from Henry county, Iowa to Des Moines when he was five years of age and there attended the public school.

He had lived on the same farm home where he died ever since he was 15 years of age.

On January 28, 1903, he was united in marriage to Ellen Dooley of Cumming, Iowa. To this union three children were born. The oldest child, Clarence, died when he was a year old. One daughter, Clara, Mrs. James Cross, lives at Perry, Iowa, and a son, Francis, at the farm home.

Mr. Roach was a member of the University Place Christian church in Des Moines.

He leaves to mourn his loss besides his wife, daughter and son, one brother, John Roach of Cumming, one sister, Mrs. Harry Allsup of Ft.Des Moines; a number of nephews and nieces, and a large number of other relatives and friends.

Mr. Roach throughout his boyhood and early manhood followed the occupation of farming, and was successful, and would have continued to be, but for a strange happening that came into his life. One day when he was about 40 years of age while stacking hay he fell from the top of the stack to the ground, falling on his back across the edge of a bucket. This caused an injury to his spine from which he never recovered. Later he was stricken with typhoid fever,

which intensified his trouble and resulted in making him an invalid for 28 years. Most of this time he was compelled to remain in bed.

Through this long illness Mr. Roach was patient, kind and considerate of all those who so willingly ministered to him.

Human life with all of its variations has its compensations. We all live in expectation and sometimes there come out of the darkest mysteries of life the sweetest benedictions. Mr. Roach has been released mercifully from his long time bondage of pain and disease. His earthly house has fallen, and joyfully his tenant spirit has gone home to be with Christ where there is no more pain.

The services were held in the Norwalk Church of Christ conducted by the Rev. A. N. Simpson. Interment was in the Orillia Cemetery.
