The remains were laid to rest in the family plot in the cemetery there. He was a member of the Knights of Pythias, and eight men of that order accompanied the remains on the long journey here, took charge of the body, and took part in the funeral rites. Deceased leaves a wife and three children to mourn the loss of a fond father. A very large number attended the funeral which was held at the old home of Mrs. Thompson. Rev. Thornbene of Norwalk, pastor at Orilla, had charge of the funeral, and left the mourners in the hands of Him who doeth all things well. Mrs. Thompson has the sympathy of all her old neighbors.
