Jonas Webb was born in 1844 and died January 6, 1925, aged 81 years.

He had been ailing for a number of years, complications setting in some two months ago resulting in his death.

He was born in Summershire, England, coming to the United States in early manhood, locating for a time in Pennsylvania, later coming to Des Moines and then to his present home at Orillia.

His widow and three children survive, Mrs. Lloyd King of Pasadena, Calif., Mrs. Robert Frey of Madrid and Homer Webb of Orillia and nine grandchildren. Five children predeceased him.

Early in life he was converted and united with the Episcopal Church in England and in 1916 he became a member of the Methodist Church of Orillia and remained true to this faith.

Jonas Webb was born in Summershire, England in 1844 and came to the United States as a young man. He located in Pennsylvania for a time, later coming to Des Moines and then to his home in Orilla, IA.

Mr. Webb was married to Miss Mary Wallace of England who died on September 3, 1882 and is buried in the WoodlandCemetery in Des Moines, IA.

To this union one son, Jacob Ernest Wallace Webb was born on August 31, 1880. He died by drowning at Dewar (Black Hawk Co.), IA on May 19, 1902 and is buried in the OrillaCemetery (Warren Co.), IA.

On March 12, 1890, Mr. Webb married Mrs. Eliza Ann Fletcher Packer Crane at Sevastopal (Polk Co), IA

Eliza Ann Fletcher, daughter of Joseph and Hannah (Powell) Fletcher was born in Montague, Monmouth Shire, South Wales, England, August 31, 1859 and came to the United States with her parents and family when she was seven years old. They settled in Hyde Park, N. Y. for a while, later moving to Scranton, PA. It was there, at the age of 18 years, she married Henry Packer who was killed about a year later in a coal mine accident leaving her with an infant son, Joseph. Joseph died in 1892 and is buried at ElmGroveCemetery.

Mrs. Packer and her brother Charles Fletcher came to Des Moines in 1879 to live with their grandparents and later moved to Medora, IA. About 1884 she married Richard Crane and moved to a farm west of Orilla. On August 2, 1885, a daughter, Evalyn (or Eva, as she was called) was born. Mr. Crane died a couple of years later. Evalyn Crane married Lloyd E. King on July 17, 1912 and died about 1977 and is buried at Mountain ViewCemetery, Pasadena, CA.

Mrs. Crane remained on the farm and in 1890 she married Jonas Webb.

Jonas Webb was a member of the Episcopal Church of England and became a member of the MethodistChurch in Orilla in 1916. Mrs. Webb was united with the MethodistChurch in Orilla in 1909.

The following children were born to this union: Helena (better known as Lena) was born on July 28, 1891. She was married to Robert L. Frey of Madrid, IA on December 25, 1912 and their children numbered fourteen, of which nine are living today. Lena passed away on April 19, 1985 and is buried at Fairview Cemetery, Madrid, IA.

Unnamed twin sons were born in 1893 and died shortly after birth and are buried in ElmGroveCemetery.

Charles Edward was born March 12, 1895 and died at Camp Forest, GA on October 22, 1918 and is buried at OrillaCemetery.

Homer W. was born January 16, 1897 and married Anna A. O'Donnell on February 7, 1921 and their children numbered ten, of which nine are living today. Homer died on February

13, 1985 and is buried in St. John'sCemetery at Cumming, IA. Homer and his family continued to reside at the farm, and Homer's son Charles now farms the family farm.

Elsie May was born on July 13, 1900 and died April 24, 1904 and is buried in the OrillaCemetery.

Jonas and Eliza lived on the same farm all their lives and that farm is now listed as being a "Century Farm".

Jonas passed away on January 6, 1925 and Eliza passed away on May 29, 1936 and are buried in the Orilla Cemetery.
